David Arthur Scholarship for All-Rounders

In 1977 Mr David Arthur became the very first Principal of Lomond School. Not only did he successfully merge our two founding schools, St Bride's and Larchfield, and lead Lomond for almost ten years. He also contributed greatly to the local community as well as to national charities. Mr Arthur was a kind and wise man who impacted significantly on those who knew him but equally the legacy of his actions impacted on thousands who did not. He was awarded the MBE for his role in establishing and developing The Samaritans in Scotland and the UK. Mr Arthur sadly passed away recently having helped us celebrate our 40th Anniversary and we believe that is entirely fitting that we should create an 'All-Rounder' Scholarship in his name.

This Scholarship will be awarded to pupils who show significant potential to contribute wholeheartedly and positively across a wide range of areas of school life.

Criteria

Candidates who possess, and have the potential to develop, clear all round abilities. Successful candidates will demonstrate a high level of academic competence, combined with strengths in other areas such as art, sport, music, or creative arts. Candidates should indicate in their application which skills and abilities they wish to demonstrate in support of their application.

Pupils will take standardised tests in English and Maths and undertake an interview.

Please note that Scholarships are awarded by the school's Scholarship Committee and their decision is final. It is not possible to appeal the decision of the committee nor will feedback be given regarding the reasons for their decision.

Scholarships are awarded for a specific entry point and cannot be deferred. All Scholarships are subject to verification of relevant qualifications and a satisfactory pupil testimonial from the existing school. Acceptance of a Scholarship implies consent under the Data Protection Act for the school to keep in contact with the pupil and for the pupil to be published in relevant publicity materials. If an applicant

is selected to receive a Scholarship and they choose to decline the Award, then the Scholarship will be void for the academic year of application.
