Living and working in Helensburgh

The town itself offers a wide range of cultural and sporting opportunities. Helensburgh is the perfect location for families who enjoy the outdoors with superb sailing, hill walking and climbing on offer. Helensburgh is well placed to allow commuters a comfortable rail or road journey to Glasgow and also allows for leisure opportunities in the West Highlands and Central Scotland. Helensburgh is a town of 17,000 people on the edge of the world famous Loch Lomond and the Trossachs National Park. Located within half-an-hour's drive of Glasgow, with its extensive cultural attractions, shopping and international airport, Helensburgh is a magnificent place to raise a family.

In upper Helensburgh, developed by wealthy Victorian Glasgow merchants, is Hill House, which is now in the care of the National Trust for Scotland. This exquisite building, complete with original furnishings, is renowned as the finest domestic masterpiece of the internationally famous Scots architect, Charles Rennie Mackintosh. Other famous local connections include Henry Bell, originator of the steamship and John Logie Baird, the inventor of the television.

Helensburgh was named by The Times as one of the top 20 places to live by the sea in the United Kingdom in March 2017. For those candidates living in Glasgow and the area surrounding Helensburgh, the town offers fantastic transport links with a regular and direct train service into Glasgow Queen Street, Edinburgh Waverley and London Euston.



Job Description

The person appointed will be a well-qualified teacher of Primary with appropriate experience. He/she will have enthusiasm and ensure the highest standards of learning, achievement and development for all pupils at Lomond School within the Junior School. If successful, you will be joining a forward thinking establishment with high expectations of its staff and pupils. As such we enjoy harnessing the talents experience and expertise of our teachers and using these to the benefit of our school. It is therefore important for all applicants to emphasise what you can offer to Lomond School in your application.

As a teacher at Lomond School, you will be expected to fully involve yourself in the extracurricular life of the School. You will also be expected to attend whole school events such as Prize Giving and Open Morning and undertake any other reasonable and relevant duties in accordance with the changing needs of the School. Responsibilities of a Teacher of Primary will include:

- Preparing and delivering high quality learning experiences to specified classes of different ages and abilities
- Taking prime responsibility for the well-being, care and academic progress of the children in their class
- Having excellent interpersonal skills and empathy with pupils
- Marking work, giving effective feedback and maintaining records of pupils' progress and development
- Assessing, recording and reporting on the work of pupils
- Researching new areas of learning, maintaining up-to-date subject knowledge, and devising and creating new learning materials in line with the philosophies of Lomond School



Job Responsibilities

- Creating and maintaining a classroom environment conducive to successful teaching and learning for pupils at the given stage
- Promoting pupil agency
- Creating a classroom ethos that supports learning, development and wellbeing
- Communicating regularly and effectively with parents
- Selecting and using a range of different learning resources and equipment, including tablets and interactive whiteboards
- Making provision for pupils with additional support needs and liaising closely with the Support for Learning (SFL) and, where relevant, external agencies
- Promoting and managing positive behaviour in the classroom and on school premises in line with the Junior School Policy
- Participating in and organising extra-curricular activities, such as fieldtrips, social activities and sporting events. This may include driving the school minibuss
- Participating in Departmental Meetings, Parents' Evenings and whole school training events
- Working in partnership with parents, teaching staff, support staff and other professionals
- Carrying out school staff duties as timetabled or when necessary
- Attending school meetings and in-service training as and when required as well as taking a responsible attitude to your own professional development
- Applying personal or professional skills to add value, perhaps via leadership, to the work of the Junior School
- Maintaining an appropriate awareness of, and working effectively within, the policies and procedures of the Junior School
- Operating safely within the workplace and maintaining a high standard of practice
- Behaving professionally at all times and maintaining confidentiality of information
- Undertaking such duties that the Head of Junior School or Principal may reasonably require
