Living and working in Helensburgh

The town itself offers a wide range of cultural and sporting opportunities. Helensburgh is the perfect location for families who enjoy the outdoors with superb sailing, hill walking and climbing on offer. The community is well served with sports clubs, vibrant music groups and a full range of youth organisations. Helensburgh is well placed to allow commuters a comfortable rail or road journey to Glasgow and also allows for leisure opportunities in the West Highlands and Central Scotland. Helensburgh is a town of 17,000 people on the edge of the world famous Loch Lomond and the Trossachs National Park. Located within half-an-hour's drive of Glasgow, with its extensive cultural attractions, shopping and international airport, Helensburgh is a magnificent place to raise a family.

In upper Helensburgh, developed by wealthy Victorian Glasgow merchants, is Hill House, which is now in the care of the National Trust for Scotland. This exquisite building, complete with original furnishings, is renowned as the finest domestic masterpiece of the internationally famous Scots architect, Charles Rennie Mackintosh. Other famous local connections include Henry Bell, originator of the steamship and John Logie Baird, the inventor of the television.

Helensburgh was named by The Times as one of the top 20 places to live by the sea in the United Kingdom in March 2017. For those candidates living in Glasgow and the area surrounding Helensburgh, the town offers fantastic transport links with a regular and direct train service into Glasgow Queen Street, Edinburgh Waverley and London Euston.



Job Description

At Lomond school, the Modern Languages Department teaches French, Spanish, Italian and we are now recruiting for a Teacher of Modern Languages to teach German. The person appointed will be a well-qualified teacher of German with appropriate experience. They will have enthusiasm and ensure the highest standards of learning, achievement and development for all pupils within Lomond School.

As a teacher at Lomond School, you will be expected to fully involve yourself in the extracurricular and boarding life of the School. You will also be expected to attend whole school events such as Prize Giving and Open Morning, Parents' events and undertake any other reasonable and relevant duties in accordance with the changing needs of the School.

Responsibilities of a Teacher of Modern Languages will include:

- Teaching German at IB Level, it is preferable that you are also qualified to teach another language offered at Lomond
- Identifying up to date, relevant resources needed to support learning and teaching, and working within a team to refresh, refine and develop these
- Ensuring that lessons are differentiated to meet the needs of individual pupils, including challenge and support as appropriate
- Preparation of creative, inspiring and effective lessons, along with robust formative and summative assessment material in accordance with the Modern Language
 Department's schemes of work
- Confidence in and ability to deliver, a wide range of teaching methodology including the most up to date strategies for online and face to face delivery



Job Responsibilities

- A willingness to engage in school-based, external and independent professional learning including curricular developments
- Ensuring high levels of achievement and attainment through high expectations, collegiate working, effective communication, and quality learning and teaching
- A commitment to collegiate working and quality assurance within the department.
- Monitoring and recording pupil progress and reporting in line with school policies.
- Contributing voluntarily to interdisciplinary learning initiatives within the school.
- Positive marketing and promotion of the work of the Modern Languages Department at home and abroad.
- Arranging and regularly refreshing effective displays of pupil work both in classrooms and around the school.
- Excellent time-management and organisational skills, including the meeting of all whole school and departmental deadlines.
- Being fully involved in the wider life of the school, including the running of extracurricular clubs and lunchtime and after-school study sessions.
- Supporting boarding pupils by liaising effectively and timeously with houseparents and teachers, providing regular evening tuition in the boarding house and supporting / running a weekend trip once every term
- Supporting the language department with cultural trips, overseas language trips and exchanges as appropriate.
- Willingly contributing to and supporting whole school events and extra-curricular activities as they arise.
- Positively representing the department and the school in person and online, to parents, Governors, visitors and other schools within the immediate locale and beyond.
